# NOTES FROM THE ARRANGER

As composers and arrangers, we bring a depth of experience, including a range of genres and influences to our work. We recognize our positions as white creators who incorporate source material and traditions from music rooted in Black culture and experience (including gospel, jazz, spirituals, and folk among others). It is our hope that our time spent studying, performing with, and collaborating with the masters in these fields is reflected in the care, respect, and enthusiasm with which we present our arrangements of this material to others.

In an effort to help sustain and support these, and other important Black forms of musical expression, we donate an industry-standard “royalty” rate for any public domain music we have arranged which is attributed to non-white sources. This royalty will go to various non-profit organizations which support Black musical arts and artists - especially in those traditions from which we have been most heavily influenced. 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**BRING ME LITTLE WATER, SILVY** is an American folksong attributed to Huddie Ledbetter (Leadbelly) and has been covered and performed by countless singers and choirs. The melody is infectious and appealing - easily taught and learned by rote.

## Performance Notes

This arrangement relies on a steady groove provided either by body percussion or cajón as well as upright bass. Electric bass or piano can be used instead if needed. If a percussionist is comfortable using a different instrument or combination of instruments to create the underlying groove they should feel free to do so. Additional percussion parts for shaker and rhythm sticks (or drumsticks) are optional. All percussion parts, a separate bass part, and a full score showing vocal and instrumental parts together are available for free at [poddbrothers.com/BMLWS](http://poddbrothers.com/BMLWS)

Choirs should deliver the text with warmth and expression, but without overly classical or “proper” pronunciation. For example, the t’s in “little” and “water” should sound closer to d’s. Vowels should be shaped as you would speak them in conversational American English.

Humming choir parts can be adapted to “Ooo” or “Oh” depending on the size of the group and environment to make sure they are heard and hold some weight.

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**ADAM PODD** is a Vermont-bred, Brooklyn-based musician, multi-instrumentalist, composer, arranger, and orchestrator. As an experienced improviser who was classically trained, his work brings a fresh and soulful sound to each new piece. He is best known in the choral world for his collaboration with twin brother Matt Podd on their viral virtual choir and orchestra version of *How Can I Keep from Singing*.

He has worked with some of the top artists and organizations in his field including The National Symphony Orchestra, The Boston Pops, Idina Menzel, Megan Hilty, Ingrid Michaelson, The Young People’s Chorus of New York City, and Brooklyn Youth Chorus in such venues as Carnegie Hall, The Kennedy Center, and others. Adam is the Director of Music at First Unitarian Congregational Society in Brooklyn where the choir often helps him to develop and premiere new works.

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
